

Best Publication by a Graduate Student in Comparative Cognition

CCS will honor the best paper by a graduate student member of the society with a \$300 prize.

Eligibility: The first author must be a CCS graduate student member. The publication must be published or in press (in the prior year, so, for the 2022 meeting, a 2021 paper), peer-reviewed, and report empirical data relevant to comparative cognition. Students wishing to be considered for this award need to submit the abstract of the paper and a short statement (< 500 words) highlighting the significance of the publication for the field of comparative cognition. The submission deadline will coincide with the deadline for abstract submission. Submissions will be reviewed by the Awards Committee and winners announced during CO3.
