

**Best Publication by a Graduate Student Award
Instructions - 2023**



Award Premise: CCS will honor the best publication by a graduate student member of the society with an award and a \$300 prize.

Award Eligibility: Students must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- The first author must be a CCS graduate student member at the time of application.
- The publication must be published or in press during the prior year (2022), peer-reviewed, and report empirical data relevant to comparative cognition.

Award Application Process: Students wishing to be considered for this award need to submit the following information:

- Name and e-mail
- Stage in program (i.e., M.Sc., Ph.D., year)
- Endorsing supervisor name and e-mail
- Abstract of the publication (reproduction or PDF original accepted)
- A brief statement (< 500 words) highlighting the significance of the publication for the field of comparative cognition
- A letter of endorsement from the student's supervisor
